Agape Feast at the Potters - While being a student at Wake Forest College in Winston Salem, N.C., I learned of the Moravian Agape Feast or Love Feast. The Moravians had settled in 1753 in Salem, N.C. as a religious community. One of their Christmas traditions was this occasion, based on the Agape Feast of the early church. It was a time of fellowship for the Christian believer. The love feast sought to strengthen the bonds and spirit of harmony, goodwill, and congeniality of the members, as well as a time to forgive disputes and discord. Its intention was to create a time of love and fellowship. This practice has recently been revived and has become another way for us to celebrate the joy of our Savior in homes as the early Christians did. The food has been simplified to consist of sweet buns, cookies, and coffee. The purpose is to celebrate and enjoy Christmas fellowship. Judy and I want to try such a Christian time in our home. The refreshments will be simply Moravian cookies and Moravian sugar cake from a Salem bakery. In addition, there will be punch, coffee, and fresh fruit. Christmas music will be in the air and the fellowship will be up to each of us.
