Papa Bears, Budgets, Giving, and Self-Employed Pastors

Pastors lives in a strange world both financially and vocationally. Pastors, according to the Federal Government, are self-employed. I pay quarterly self-employment payments in addition to other taxes because of this designation from the Federal Government. There is also the sense in which it is God who calls men and women to the pastoral vocation, and it is our faith tradition that sets out the work and calling of the pastor. In many ways, a pastor does not work for the "local" church but works for God in that particular place.

But speaking practically, God does not miraculously drop pastor's compensation out of heaven into a checking account (at least God has never done this for me). It is the local church who enters into a contract with a pastor and supports that pastor financially. And to offer another layer to this, the church is really supporting God's work in their community by supporting the pastor, they are not simply "paying the preacher." One final layer would be to add that giving is an act of worship and discipleship, not simply supporting the budget.

All of this is a long-winded way to what I really want to say.

Gerald Hagen, the church's treasurer, will be quick to tell you in past years whenever we have experienced a snowstorm resulting in worship being cancelled for one, two, or three Sundays, it has been difficult for the church financially. So, in March, when we cancelled Sanctuary Worship for what would become twenty-one weeks, no one knew what would happen financially to May Memorial Church. I didn't know what the upcoming months would look like for my family and me. Yes, we give to our church for God's work in the community, but my livelihood also depends on MMBC.

What has happened has been nothing short of a miracle. Giving to MMBC over the past six months has exceeded what anyone could have expected. We are in uncharted territory in that our giving has exceeded our budget. And God's work has continued in many familiar and new ways in our community. And God has taken care of my family and me. I'm grateful to God for this. And I'm grateful to you. (continued on page 2)

and I both would have done whatever necessary to supplement as needed for our family during this crisis. But God provided.


