

I recently watched the episode in which Andy tells Opie that he really doesn't need the material he is learning in history class, and that Ms. Crump, his teacher, is unreasonable in her expectations of her students. Opie and his buddies do not complete their homework, and the next day in class inform "Old Lady Crump" that Andy has given them permission to not complete their assignments. Ms. Crump marches into the sheriff's office boldly telling Andy that he has made her job very hard, that he has undermined what she was trying to accomplish with her students. Andy sees the error of his ways, and he works to amend the damage he has caused.

It is an important reminder of the vital role between parents and school faculty in student's lives and learning.

School has resumed for our students and teachers, and they have gone back to learning in a radically different way than we could have ever imagined. The amount of technology teachers are having to master and use for virtual learning is overwhelming. Teachers and administrators are working to keep students safe and healthy while they are in the building. Teachers are working hard to keep students engaged who never step into the building. It is a herculean task. Our teachers, administrators, and school staff deserve our gratitude and appreciation for the work they are doing.

This year I have decided to include in my daily prayers teachers, administrators, and all school staff. I have been praying for them in worship, and this will continue. In a world in which it is far too easy (most notably on social media) to tear down and attack schools and staff and teachers, I believe that it is more important than ever that principals, teachers, and school staff receive the trust, support, and prayers that we are called to give.

If (actually, when) any of my children have had an issue at school Beverley or I have showed up. I'm an advocate for my children, and we have always found in Powhatan that faculty and staff have been advocates for my children as well. I'm grateful for Powhatan Schools, for my children's teachers and principals. We could not ask for better.

I love the Quaker singer/songwriter Carrie Newcomer, and her song *I Believe* is a beautiful list of the many things she believes. She sings that she believes "there are some debts that we can never repay," and she believes that "there are some words that you can never unsay." She believes that "there is healing in the sound of a voice, and that a summer tomato is a cause to rejoice." Early in this song she proclaims that she believes "there's a place in heaven for those who teach in public school."

I'm grateful for those who teach our children, they serve us well.
