This table does not belong to any denomination, church or community. It belongs to Jesus.

## It was at table that he met people, heard their stories and shared his.

It was at table that he deepened his friendship with poor folk and prostitutes, the business class and puzzled bystanders.

## It was at table that he shared profound insights into who God is and what God wants.

And it was at table, with bread and cup, that he initiated the ordinance we now celebrate.

## So come to this table. Leave behind any baggage of arrogance or unworthiness.

Do not think, 'This is not for me.' Think rather of Jesus saying, 'I am for you,' and accept his invitation to be the friend he cherishes and longs to feed.

## What we do here, we do in imitation of what Christ first did.

On the night on which he was betrayed; and as they were sitting at a meal, Jesus took a piece of bread and broke it. He gave it to the disciples saying, "This is my body broken for you. do this in remembrance of me." Later, after they had eaten, he took a cup of wine and he said, "This cup is the new relationship with God made possible because of my death. Drink this all of you, and remember me."

So now we do as Jesus did.
